Mayor Cox - called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

Roll Call: Trustee Morgan absent

Pledge of Allegiance - led by Deputy Mayor Amrhein

Visitor's Forum

Sheila Piper expressed concerns with campfires within the Village and night burning of trash within the Village. Ms. Piper stated that there are neighbors out burning trash at all hours of the night keeping her and her family from getting back to sleep because of the smoke.

Mayor Cox stated that there should not be any burning of trash within the Village.

Ms. Piper mentioned the frequency of fires from her neighbors regardless of the time of day or the temperature.

Mayor Cox asked the Code Enforcement/Zoning Officer Mullikin if this fell under his monitoring responsibilities.

CEO/ZEO Mullikin explained that the DEC should be contacted and questions on the New York State Opening Burning Law should be discussed as to their responsibility.

Mayor Cox stated that the local police and DEC are your best bet at finding answers.

Deputy Mayor Amrhein stated the Village should work on a local burning law.

Ms. Piper stated she thought that years ago it was decided somewhere that if a campfire bothered a neighbor then there would be no campfires. Ms. Piper also wanted the Board to know she does not like to be the one who complains about the smoke.

Mayor Cox stated the Village can look into the burning law.

Larry Mallaber distributed and presented the proposed 2017-2019 Nunda Fire Department Budget to the Village Board of Trustees. Discussed were New York State mandates for turn out gear upkeep, required physicals, and the replacement of fire trucks.

The Mayor thanked Mr. Mallaber for his presentation with further discussion to take place later this year with the Village Board reviewing more carefully the proposed budget.

Maxine Snelgrove provided an update as to the status of the 2016 Nunda Yard Sales Day, August 20, 2016. The Chamber of Commerce and the Village of Nunda are working hard and maps will be submitted and printed early in the next week.

Chief Water Operator Bennett discussed the requirements and operational readiness of the Village Well. If the Village Well Site were to be operational the Village would be under a boil water advisement before consumption. The Village Well is operational.

H. Village Clerk hours change request

The Village Clerk-Treasurer requested hours of operational change. The Clerk-Treasurer has requested hours to be changed from 9:00AM through 4:30PM to 8:30AM through 4:00PM. This change would allow the Nunda Government Center to be open an additional thirty minutes per day for resident accommodations. The change would take effect October 1, 2016 after the Village Tax season.

Old Business

A. Nunda Zoning Law: Temporary Structures

Resolution no. 2016-123

BE IT RESOLVED that the Nunda Village Board of Trustees approve the revocation of current Zoning Law for the Village of Nunda known as Local Law No. 1 of 2005, and,

FURTHERMORE, approve the proposed Town and Village of Nunda Joint Zoning Law of August 2016, further defined as Village of Nunda Local Law No. 1 of the year 2016, and to provide for a Joint Public Hearing for adoption of said law, with the Town of Nunda as set for Saturday, 11:00AM, August 13, 2016.

The motion was made by Trustee Snyder, seconded by Deputy Mayor Amrhein. Carried 3-1 (Allen).

B. Water Law – Updated Law provided to committee for review

Deputy Mayor Amrhein presented to the Village Board proposed changes for amending the current Water Law of 2004, including a definition of what a living unit is. Discussion at the next Village Board Meeting on amending the current law will be scheduled.

Trustee Allen had concerns with an individual residence having several occupants versus a two *living unit* home that may have only a couple individuals as to why a two *living unit* home is charged for two *living units* and a single family home with ten or more folks living under one roof is charged just the single family unit charge for water and sewer. As explained by Deputy Mayor Amrhein, the Water Law of 2004 states that each family unit will be charged accordingly. A single family regardless of how many live under the one roof will be charged singularly and a home with more than one *living unit* will be charged according to the number of *living units* regardless of how many individuals occupy the home.

C. Email account addresses for Board Members

The Mayor, all Trustees, Clerk-Treasurer, Deputy Clerk, DPW and WWTP Operators have received an email account specific to the job title of such individual. The email accounts will be used while performing the duties as such and will remain open and in effect upon any transfer of personnel from said job title. Email accounts to be added to Village Webpage.

D. FEMA – Update on Melodee Lane portion of projects

Mayor Cox is researching the requirements for a file of extension for additional funding for Melodee Lane.

E. *Land survey* – DPW Building property – tabled for future discussion. Complete annexation of Village Well-site before starting another project.

F. Annexation – Village Well-Site - Tax map ID# 184.-1-37

Livingston County Clerk has requested, per NYS GML 717, survey maps for proper filing, Mylar maps, paper maps and an appropriate filing fee to fulfill the NYS annexation requirements. Surveyor has requested a copy of the land abstract. The Village Clerk-Treasurer will review all files to see if this document is on hand.

G. Village Park - Lease

Mayor Cox requested additional discussion on the proposed Agreement to Lease of the Village Park. The Mayor stated the Village has taken care of and maintained the Village Park for more than sixteen years. Mayor Cox stated his disappointment in the Village of Nunda not being included in any promotional activities that were being presented by Trinity Church of Nunda this year. Deputy Mayor Amrhein asked if we had received any recognition over the years for all of the work that has been done. Mayor Cox stated he did not believe so.

Trustee Snyder stated the Village Park is a welcoming point into the community and that we need to work together.

Trustee Allen asked does the church want control?

Mayor Cox stated the Government Center would be a good location for any potential future Music in the Park activities, parking is available, the front porch is large enough.

Trustee Snyder stated the Village is currently paying electric, maintenance, and mowing the lawn of the Village Park.
